Additional Cost if we choose to use a CART for waste pickup of Tuesdays and Fridays.

I have been working on the numbers and it is very complex, but the reality is the cost will go up either way. If you think about it we are bringing the Wheelie Bins in to ultimately move to a one arm vehicle collection in the future, however Mondays still require the rear loader for the Yard Waste, Tuesday could have the side loaders, but would also have to have the rear loader to cover for the contaminated bags from Monday (So rather than 2 trucks, would have to have 4 with additional staff), Wednesday

we could just use side loader as long as everyone uses the bin, and Friday we could again use the side loader, but would still need the rear loaders for the Bulk.

I just purchased a couple of side loaders for a contract in Texas that we won. Each vehicle cost \$385,000, so, even spreading that over 7 years with no finance costs) the cost per month would be \$1.80 per household, based on 2555, plus the additional labor for those 2 trucks = 20hours per truck per week = \$0.81c per property on top, plus Fuel, Tires etc, so the real cost if we were to go down that route would be around \$3.20 on top of the bin cost.

My suggestion is that we push the bins from a safety perspective, collected by the existing fleet, and a beautification of the city, rather than households having 15 different types of cans out the front of their house each collection day.

- 7. Work with residents to lessen the amount of waste by changing buying habits
- 8. Students
 - a. Promote recycling and conservation education
 - b. Suggest ideas in the proper disposal of waste products
 - c. Learn how to lessen the amount of waste products
- 9. Meet quarterly with Waste provider to:
 - a. Improve communication among City/Commissioners/Committee/Residents/Students
 - b. Improve service to residents
 - c. Look for solutions to any ongoing problems
 - d. Consider any changes that might affect residents
 - e. Discuss any new equipment or programs coming online
 - f. Review reports Waste/Recycling tonnage
 - g. Review resident complaints and suggest any needed changes
 - h. Review commercial accounts for any needed changes
- 10. Schedule bi-yearly Electronic Waste collection event and disposal
- 11. Send out information about Hazardous Waste disposal
- 12. Send out information about Paper Shredding
- 13. Partake in bi-yearly Belle Isle community events
- 14. Create and send out evaluation of Waste provider services
- 15. Assist with the bids for solid waste hauling and recycling contracts
- 16. Review of proposals (RFP) for Solid Waste and Recycling and make recommendation to City Council
